In addition to a neutral black and white palette, the other sure-fire recipe for a timeless décor is the use of symmetrical placement. In this home, the owner takes comfort in the natural order and balance of symmetry as evidenced by the dining area layout that is highlighted by the twin pendant lamps over the table as well as the feature wall that is beset with framed family photos arranged in a classic four by four formation.

The theme continues into the master room where a touch of gold on the headboard and mirror frames above the nightstands lift the monochromatic interior and add a sense of luxury.

Although the walls throughout this apartment are predominantly white, a strong dark wood panel wall that lead to the kitchen area anchor the space and serves to accentuate the natural brightness of the surrounding white furnishings.





Tips

If this chapter is anything to go by, it seems that 2011 is the year where neutral colours make a big impact in luxury homes. Technically speaking, black, white and shades of grey in between are classified as neutrals, rather than colours. When used to contrast each other however, the impact can be as powerful as the brightest of colours.
